PROFILE

Allie Pepper is an Australian high-altitude mountaineer with more than two decades of experience climbing in extreme environments.

She has accumulated twelve summits of the world's 8000-metre peaks, including multiple ascents without supplemental oxygen, and is currently undertaking a long-term project to climb all fourteen 8000-metre peaks without oxygen.

Allie's work explores leadership, decision-making, preparation, and responsibility under pressure. Alongside expedition climbing, she speaks internationally and collaborates on documentary storytelling that examines ambition, fear, and self-leadership in high-risk environments.

She is recognised for her grounded approach, attention to detail, and commitment to climbing with integrity and respect for people and place.

CURRENT PROJECT

The 14 Peaks Project

Allie is currently working toward climbing all fourteen of the world's 8000-metre peaks without supplemental oxygen.

The project began on 15 July 2023 with the no-oxygen ascent of Broad Peak (8,051 m) in Pakistan. It is a multi-year undertaking that combines expedition climbing, public speaking, and media engagement.

The project focuses not only on physical endurance, but on preparation, risk assessment, leadership, and decision-making in environments where mistakes carry serious consequences.



DOCUMENTARY FILM

Limitless Above the Clouds

Limitless Above the Clouds is a 48-minute documentary film exploring ambition, fear, responsibility, and self-leadership in extreme environments.

The film follows Allie's journey into the world's highest mountains and reflects on the internal and external challenges involved in pursuing a long-held goal under conditions of uncertainty.

The film has screened at live events and is available online through a pay-what-you-can viewing model to ensure global accessibility.

SPEAKING

Allie delivers keynote presentations and participates in moderated discussions for leadership teams, organisations, and events internationally.

Her speaking draws on lived experience from high-altitude environments and explores themes including leadership under pressure, resilience, preparation, and navigating major life transitions.
